Open Reach and other Companies have been installing fibre optic cables in the road and village to speed up Broadband.</p> <p>If you receive notification at any time that a Company will be blocking the road please let LB know so that all residents can be notified.</p>	Residents

7	<p>Double Yellow Lines: LB will ask Martin Allen if any decision has been made.</p> <p><i>Reply from Martin that our request approved: "Paynesfield Road junction with Johns Road: Introduce double yellow lines on the southern side of the junction to improve sightlines for drivers exiting Johns Road and road safety, and remove a short section of the double yellow lines in Johns road on the north side of the junction in order to update the traffic order to match what is already on the ground. (This second part is just a change to the traffic regulation order and will not result in any change to the existing road markings)."</i></p> <p><i>Reply from Becky Rush that they probably won't get done until later in the summer.</i></p>	LB
